The Possums: Junior Room

Over the past few weeks, the students have been exploring texts about school and relating them to our own experiences. We have talked about how it feels starting school or something new in our lives and how this can make us feel. Our class read a story called, "Possum Goes to School" and we used this in our reading and writing sessions. Using adjectives to describe a character, changing the main character in the text and using a writing planner to help us with some writing.

During our Mathematics lessons, we decided to improve our basic number fact knowledge by implementing our Ninja Sliders, working on Friends of 10 and Friends of 20 and creating our own adding machines. Measurement was another area we focused on, learning how to use informal types of measurement such as paper clips, Unifix cubes and counters to measure the length of items in our room. Then we moved on to measuring ourselves; tracing around our bodies and using formal units of measurement such as centimetres and metres with a measuring tape.



This year, we have implemented our bush classroom sessions which occur up in our bush block at school. We are very fortunate to have this area to utilise in our school and the students have been keen to learn new skills and information about our native flora and fauna.

We have looked at local snakes in our area and talked about the importance of snakes in our ecosystem. Students took part in a snake bite first aid class, learning how to bandage a bitten limb and how we milk snakes to create antivenom that saves lives every year in Australia.

Then our students got to experience an old pastime of many children, whittling wood. They learnt about soft and hard woods and how to select the best type of wood for whittling. We discovered that Australia is home to the toughest wood in the world, the Buloke tree (Allocasuarina luehmannii). We used potato peelers to remove the bark from Willow branches and tried to carve the end of the branch into a point. This activity helps us work on our technique and safety when whittling wood.











Science

This term in science we are exploring life cycles and have purchased some fertilized eggs to hatch out in our classroom. We have also been learning a lot of information about chickens in the lead up to our chicken coop being built later this year. Did you know?

- 1. Chickens are the closest living relatives of dinosaurs! Scientific evidence has proven the shared common ancestry between chickens and the Tyrannosaurus rex.
- 2. Like humans, chickens have colour vision, and can see red, green and blue light. However, what makes chicken vision unique from ours is that they are also able to see ultraviolet light, which are the colours you see when using a black light!







Clean Up Australia Day for schools was held on Friday 28th March and our students did a wonderful job cleaning up around our school. It was good to see that the school ground itself was relatively rubbish free, but we were quite surprised by the amount of rubbish we collected around the front and sides of our school.

Thanks to the students for giving up their Golden Time to help look after our planet!

As previously mentioned, our senior students began the ReCranked in Schools (Ris) Program, thanks to The Y Ballarat.

ReCranked is a hands-on learning program supporting students to learn bike maintenance and restoration skills. The program fosters an environment to build new skills, confidence, meaningful relationships and teamwork skills with peers. ReCranked will be running each Tuesday for the remainder of Term 1.

In pairs, our senior students will be working together to fix up a project bike which will be donated back to the community through ReCranked, helping to add to the over 3000 bikes already restored and donated!

All Mount Egerton PS students are being encouraged to bring along their own bike and a helmet to school from next Tuesday, 18th Feb, to ride during recess/lunchtime and have their bikes serviced by the senior students, if they would like.
