Morning arrivals



Teaching and Learning Weeks 6–7

Junior students P-2

Reading: During Reading, we will be exploring how author's organise information texts and why. We will also begin to explore how our background knowledge can help us understand new content about a topic.

Writing: Students will be working through the writing process to draft their Information Report based on an ocean creature. They will explore how to write an interesting beginning that engages the reader.

Number: In Number, students will be exploring different subtraction strategies that they can use to solve subtraction problems. We will also look at how addition and subtraction are linked.

Respectful Relationships: Students will be learning about asking others for help when self-soothing strategies are not helping to calm their worries. They will be exploring strategies and language they can use, through role-play and drawing activities.

LOTE (Prep): Students will be learning to sign numbers 1-20, while learning more about deaf culture. Senior students 3-6

Reading: Senior students are loving their new novel study on The Wild Robot. We have teamed up with the senior class at Warrenheip PS to plan and share the experience between the two classes.

Writing: We have recently begun our information reports unit, with each senior student focusing on writing their first report about an Australian ocean animal. They will have the chance to complete a second report on an ocean animal of choice from anywhere in the world.

Number: Students are learning strategies for solving a range of subtraction problems, including equations with whole, decimal and negative numbers.

Applied maths: We will be continuing to work on creating line graphs, pie graphs and choosing the most appropriate graph to display given data.

Respectful Relationships: Students are learning how to be brave during situations that make them feel anxious or scared.

Other curriculum areas to note:

Applied Maths (Prep) with Ms Carly: Students will be collecting and sorting data from their peers and the world around them. They will continue using data to create column graphs, pie graphs and pictograms using fun interactive manipulatives.

Critical and Creative Thinking with Miss Millar: Students learnt about the importance of bees and helped to gather sticks to create small pollinator nests for travelling insects. We went to the bush classroom to place the pollinator nests in the trees, which the playgroup went out and explored. Instructions were sent home with students to make more complex pollinator nests at home with their families.



School Saving Bonus

Dear parents and carers

You may have seen the recent announcement of the School Saving Bonus, as part of the Victorian Budget 2024/25. We are sharing more information about how families will be able to access and use this support.

This one-off support will include \$400 for each eligible student to help families cover the costs of school uniforms and activities in 2025.

It will be available to parents and carers of every child enrolled in a Victorian government school in 2025.

Cash will not be paid directly to individuals or families. Instead, families will receive the bonus as credits on their school accounts that will help meet the costs of your children's activities and uniforms.

Existing supports

The School Saving Bonus support will be in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for <u>camps, sports, excursions</u> and uniforms.

The application-based <u>Affordable School Uniform program</u>, through State Schools' Relief, will continue to be available to families experiencing financial hardship or other forms of vulnerability and short-term crisis. This program allows schools to make multiple applications for support on parents' behalf throughout the year if needed.

There will be more information and guidance about the School Saving Bonus in Term 3, 2024, ahead of its implementation in 2025.
